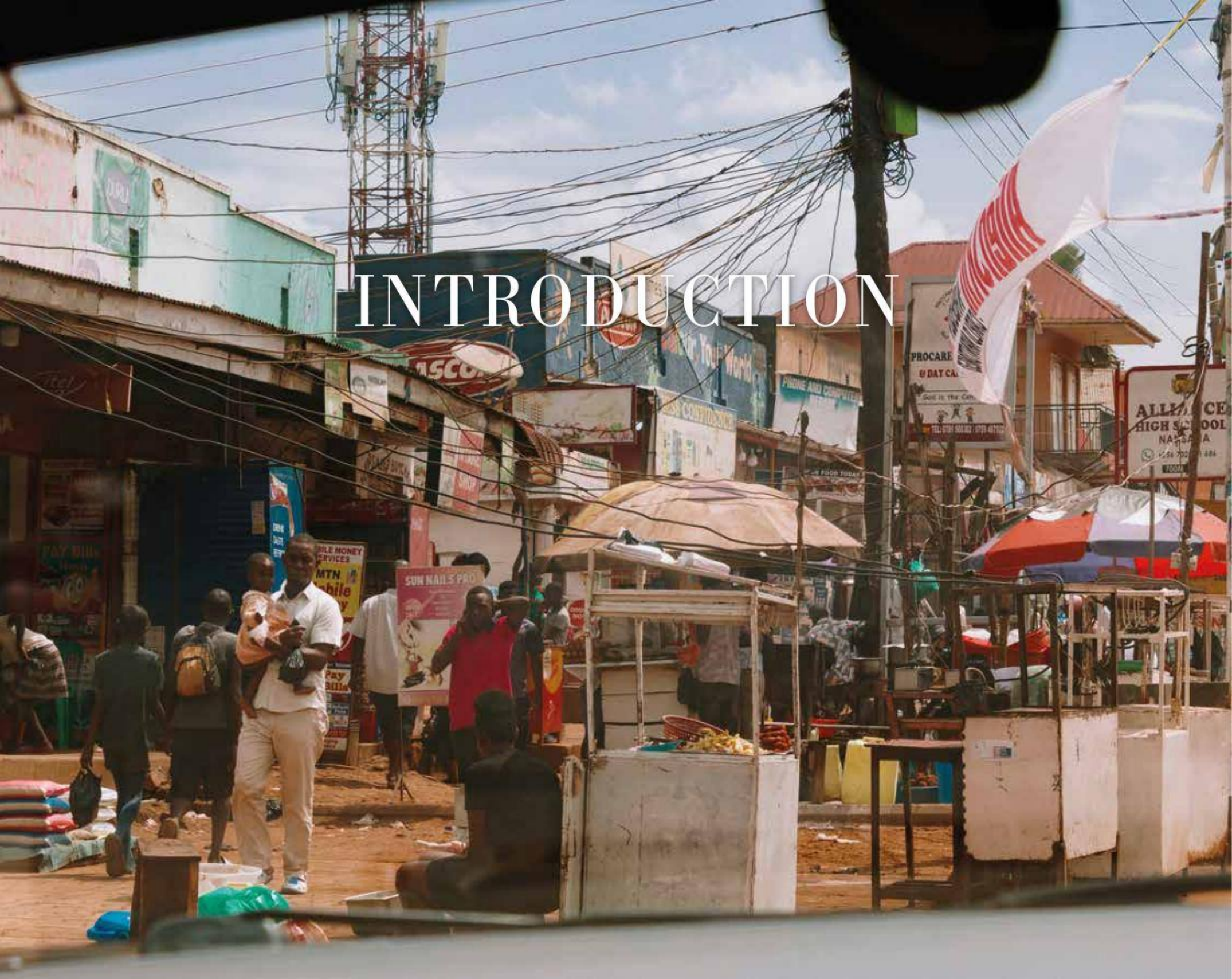

HERD OF ANTELOPE ON HIGH ALERT

A sudden rustle in the grass. Heads snap up, ears twitch, and bodies tense. A herd of antelope stands frozen in a moment of instinctual awareness—watchful, waiting. Somewhere, unseen, a predator moves. In the delicate tension between stillness and flight, life and death hang in a silent balance.

GIRAFFE IN FULL STRIDE

Graceful yet commanding, the giraffe moves across the open plains, a giant in a world where speed can mean survival. Every step is a calculated effort—stride too slow, and vulnerability becomes fatal. Yet in its towering presence, there is an elegance, a resilience carried in its rhythmic gait.



THE STALKING JACKAL

Eyes locked, muscles taut, the jackal moves with a hunter's precision. Every step is a whisper against the earth, a silent question of opportunity. In the dance of predator and prey, patience is key. Not every hunt ends in success, but for the jackal, persistence is the difference between hunger and survival.
